Leadership Message: EMBRACING THE DIGITAL!

The Discovery Orchestra's 2019–2020 season was indeed an ambitious one. The recording of our fifth educational television production, *Discover The Firebird*, and its subsequent nationwide distribution by American Public Television was an exciting accomplishment. In order for a modest nonprofit music educational organization to produce a show featuring an orchestra of 85 musicians before a live audience of more than five hundred attendees, our staff, board, and production partner Midnight Media Group had to be "all in." The passion and support of our more than forty television program sponsors, including individuals, couples, foundations and the New Jersey State Council on the Arts, made this production literally soar!

We're grateful that we can take this opportunity to celebrate *Discover The Firebird*, and know that our music listening mission has impacted many thousands of individuals who have watched the program since its debut on NJTV on April 29, 2020. Considering the devastating consequences of the COVID pandemic, we were certainly fortunate to have the show completely edited and ready for American Public Television in early March.

From the April 29th premiere through June 30, 2020, there were 117 broadcasts in 51 national television markets including 12 of the top 30, covering 24 states and reaching over 39 million households. We learned from actual Nielsen ratings that nearly 12,000 people in New Jersey, New York and Philadelphia tuned in to watch the premiere broadcast. The show later won two 2020 Telly Awards in the Cultural

and Education categories. And we have received wonderful feedback from viewers across the country such as, "Stumbled upon this quite by accident on our Maryland PBS station. What a joy! Firebird is my favorite piece of music and your wonderful program just enhanced my appreciation of Stravinsky's genius. Thank you and keep up your great work of feeding our souls!"

In addition to the new television production, we continued to 'embrace the digital' with twice-monthly episodes of our *Inside Music* radio program, produced in partnership with WWFM *The Classical Network*. Prior to the pandemic's onset, we were fortunate to present seven outreach sessions in live settings with our community partners including the Paterson Music Project, Trenton Music Makers and Warrenbrook Seniors. After we relocated our administrative office from Millburn to Summit, New Jersey in mid-February, we presented an *Intimate Afternoon* recital at the Visual Arts Center in Summit featuring a talented young clarinet quartet from the New Jersey Youth Symphony.

By season's end, The Discovery Orchestra, along with the rest of the world, found ourselves fully in the virtual sphere. We're grateful that we can continue to advance our music listening mission with our digital partners and are so thankful to you and all our supporters for journeying with us.

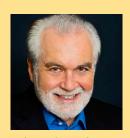

Outreach

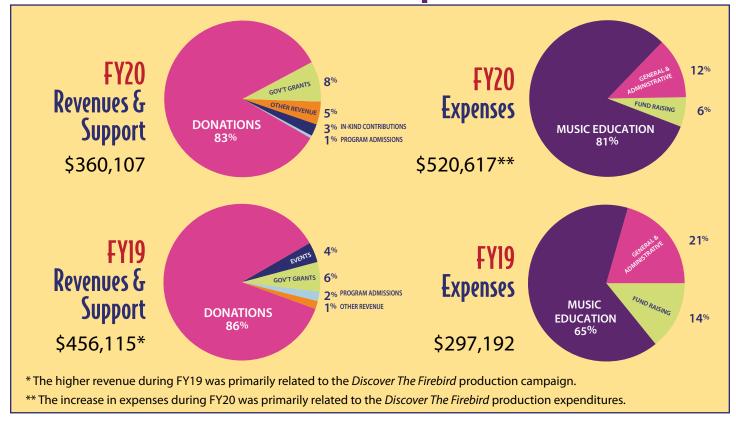
