Ruihan Zhang, piano

Ruihan Zhang began learning the piano at the age of 5. She received her Bachelor and Master of Music degrees at the Manhattan School of Music, and is currently pursuing her Doctor of Musical Arts degree at Rutgers University. She was granted a full scholarship for all of these programs.

Ruihan has performed repertoire ranging from George Frideric Handel and Franz Schubert to John Corigliano. She has given solo concerts in many major venues in the United States and China, including Kauffman Concert Hall, Steinway Hall, and Shanghai Oriental Art Center. She performed Beethoven's *Piano Concerto No. 5* with the Middle School Youth Orchestra affiliated with the Shanghai Conservatory of Music in Shanghai Concert Hall. About the Artistcont. Ruihan has won a variety of competitions. She won 2nd Prize in the Asian Youth Music Competition, 1st Prize in the Yangtze-River Cup Piano

Competition, 1st Prize in the Beethoven Piano Competition, and 1st Prize in the Pacific International Piano Competition.

Ruihan has also participated in various music festivals. She was invited to Piano Summer in New Paltz in 2017 and the International Holland Music Session in 2019. She also gave concerts in major concert halls during the session.

In addition to her solo performances, Ruihan is also active as a collaborative pianist and harpsichordist. Among other works, she has performed the *Trio for Flute, Violin, and Piano* by Bohuslav Martinu and *Theme and Variations* by Girolamo Frescobaldi. She has also participated in orchestra performances. She worked with the Manhattan School of Music's Symphony Orchestra during the 2016-17 and 2021-22 seasons, and with the School's Sinfonia/ Philharmonia Orchestra in the 2017-18 season.

Ginny Johnston

Virginia Johnston started her journey with the Philharmonic Orchestra of New Jersey (The Discovery Orchestra's [TDO] predecessor organization) after having received her Bachelor of Music (Summa Cum Laude, University Scholar) from Syracuse University and her Master of Music (with Honors) from Boston University in both composition and clarinet performance.

Having played clarinet with the New Jersey Youth Symphony in high school under Maestro Maull, Ginny has been so pleased to work alongside him to guide the artistic and administrative growth of the Orchestra for the past three decades. Over the years, she also studied choral conducting at Westminster Choir College through their Continuing Education department and earned her Certificate in Nonprofit Management from The Nonprofit Center at LaSalle University.

Ginny has worn many hats with the Orchestra, starting as an Administrator in 1992, shifting to Managing Director in 1999 and then Executive Director in 2009, a role she held for 13 years. As of September 2022, Ginny assumed the Finance Director position. Among her highlights with TDO, she has served as Executive Producer for three public television programs and written grants resulting in well over one million dollars in funding.

Outside of her work with The Discovery Orchestra, Ginny has been a professional free-lance clarinetist, conductor and composer in the tri-state area over the past 30 years.

Ginny's works, several of which are published, have been performed by various area ensembles, including the New Jersey Youth Symphony at Alice Tully Hall. In 1992 she co-founded Triad Arts Ensemble, a nonprofit performing arts organization. Through Triad, Ginny has chaired the annual *Canticles for Life* AIDS Benefit Concerts in New Jersey since 1997. Over \$200,000 has been raised in this effort to date. Since 1995, she has been Conductor of the Triad Vocal Ensemble, a mixed adult community choir specializing in accessible contemporary repertoire as well as traditional works, with a focus on female composers and New Jersey composers. Ginny was recently appointed Assistant Conductor of the professional Garden State Symphonic Band and is Associate Conductor for the Maplewood Community Band. Outside of the classical music world, she has performed locally as a singer-songwriter in folk-rock and jazz styles and has released two recordings of original songs. More recently Ginny has taken classes in improv comedy and performs with her troupe, "Whatever, Dad."



Viewers will be able to gain a better understanding of the "Organ" Symphony Finale by engaging with Maestro Maull's insights and questions on aspects such as tempo, instrumentation and other musical elements, in order to learn how to "listen better" — which is the guiding mission of The Discovery Orchestra.

About Our tistic Director



Artistic Director of The Discovery Orchestra and three-time Emmy-nominated public television personality, George Marriner Maull has helped individuals nationwide to heighten their classical music listening pleasure through his *Discovery Concerts*© distributed by American Public Television and available on Amazon Prime.

His signature course, *Fall in Love with Music*, originally recorded as an 8-part public television series, can also be streamed on Amazon. Currently in its fourth season, his public radio show *Inside Music* is broadcast on the 2nd and 4th Saturdays each month at 7:30 pm eastern time on WWFM, 89.1 *The Classical Network* in central New Jersey and may be streamed worldwide at wwfm.org.

Maestro Maull's New Jersey musical affiliations began when he was appointed Assistant Conductor of the New Jersey Symphony Orchestra for the 1979-80 season and founding Music Director of the New Jersey Youth Symphony that same season. He led the NJYS for eighteen years until 1997, including three performances at Carnegie Hall and the European tours of 1983, 1985, 1987 and 1989 to Belgium, The Netherlands, England, Romania, Hungary and Poland. Under his direction, the New Jersey Youth Symphony received *First Prize* at both the 1983 and 1985 *European Music Festival for Young People* in Neerpelt, Belgium and was featured in a 1987 WNET New York Channel 13 documentary entitled *Art Effects: Young & Noteworthy*.

Additional posts have included Music Director of the Louisville Ballet, Louisville Singers, Heritage Theater of Louisville, Plainfield Symphony, Bloomingdale Chamber Orchestra, Eastern Suffolk Symphony and Philharmonic Orchestra of New Jersey, including appearances at Lincoln Center as well as fourteen consecutive presentations of the Philharmonic Orchestra of New Jersey's *Annual Viennese Ball* at the Waldorf-Astoria in New York City. He has appeared as a guest conductor with the Kentucky Opera, New York Virtuosi Chamber Symphony, New Jersey Symphony Orchestra, Washington Square Festival Orchestra in New York and the orchestras of the Aaron Copland School of Music and the University of Louisville School of Music. Recordings include CD's conducting the Polish National Radio Symphony Orchestra for the Naxos label.

Formerly a professional violist, he was a member of the Louisville Orchestra, Aspen Festival Orchestra, Caramoor Festival Orchestra, Opera Orchestra of New York, Brooklyn Philharmonic and American Symphony Orchestra, performing under legendary musicians Igor Stravinsky, Aaron Copland, Pierre Boulez and Sir Georg Solti, among others. Now in his 18th season as host of the New Jersey Performing Arts Center's Classical Overtures, he has presented pre-concert chats before such ensembles as The Philadelphia Orchestra, Vienna Symphony Orchestra, Boston Symphony Orchestra, New York Philharmonic and Academy of St. Martin in the Fields and artists Yuja Wang, Joshua Bell, Renée Fleming and Itzhak Perlman. The University of Louisville honored him in 1994 as a Distinguished Alumnus and named him a 2018 Alumni Fellow. His biography has been listed in Who's Who in America each year since 1994, and in 2018 the Marquis Who's Who Publications Board honored him with an Albert Nelson Marguis Lifetime Achievement Award. Born and raised in Philadelphia, George Marriner Maull resides in Bedminster, New Jersey with his wife, pianist and accompanist Marcia Maull.

Transforming Listening, Enhancing Lives

We believe that listening to classical music and perceiving its many expressive aspects arouses compelling emotional responses deep within us. This engagement helps us to fully experience our own feelings, as well as to understand the feelings of others. The non-stop presence of electronically reproduced music in our society has sadly trained generations of people to merely *hear* music as 'sonic wallpaper', providing background accompaniment for virtually every activity in our daily lives. People have been conditioned to *ignore* music, rather than to be *completely present* with it. To address this, The Discovery Orchestra teaches the listening skills that help people to really *connect* with classical music. Founded in 1987 as the Philharmonic Orchestra of New Jersey, The Discovery Orchestra provides listening interactions for people of all ages, from novices to classical music enthusiasts. Beginning with our first *Discovery Concert* in 1996 and culminating with our mission and name change ten years later, all of our programs are now educational in nature.

Our shows are now available on PBS Passport and Amazon Prime Video. They, along with our Discovery Orchestra Chat© videos on YouTube, are also streamed to classrooms and libraries around the United States by Films Media Group. Our public radio program, Inside Music, is broadcast on the second and fourth Saturdays every month at 7:30 pm ET on WWFM 89.1 The Classical Network in Princeton, and can be streamed worldwide at www.wwfm.org. And just this month, we are pleased to introduce our new online game app, AHA! Classical -- an exciting new way to connect with classical music regardless of age or musical experience.
